BREAKING THE CYCLE

A New Way of Life Reentry Project is a non-profit organization founded in 1998 to provide housing and reentry support to formerly incarcerated women and their children. A New Way of Life serves up to 50 women and children per year, and offers a wide range of programs and services to help facilitate a successful transition back to community life.

As a leading reentry community organization, A New Way of Life also organizes former prisoners and their loved ones to remove barriers to reentry, increase resources for prevention and reentry services, and reduce the reliance on incarceration. We envision a society that treats all people with dignity and respect, and in which communities unite to support their members to excel.

A New Way of Life believes in the ability of each of its residents to achieve freedom and independence. To facilitate this growth, we provide three stages of services to our residents:

STAGE I: GETTING STARTED

We provide...

- Pick ups from prison and jail
- Clothing and toiletries
- Assistance in obtaining government documents
- Weekly 12-step meeting onsite
- Assistance in obtaining health and mental health services.
- Opportunity to participate in day-treatment
- Assistance in meeting conditions of parole/probation
- Transportation assistance

STAGE II: GETTING ESTABLISHED

We provide...

- Assistance with family reunification, custody, and child support
- Referrals to career and educational counseling
- Educational programming on topics such as rebuilding credit, record expungement, and effective parenting

STAGE III: GETTING INDEPENDENT

We provide...

- Assistance in searching for permanent housing
- Support in developing a drug-free lifestyle
- Leadership development and advocacy training
